We had 17 submissions and accepted 6 papers. The acceptance rate is 37.5% (without 1 dropped paper), which didn't satisfied a desired value (50%). The Accepted papers covered wide range of Information System which consisted of design method, management of information system, social network, and privacy protection in data mining.
